Who you are

Ideally you will have past support work experience, be studying in a relevant field, and/or hold Certificate 3 in Individualised Support. You will be required to prove a satisfactory Police Check, a current Working with Children Check, up-to-date First Aid and CPR and hold a current Victorian Drivers licence with access to an insured motor vehicle. You will also be willing to undergo a Disability Workers Exclusion Scheme Check.

What

You would be providing practical support in a range of real-life activities that help young people learn independence skills, develop genuine relationship and engage in their community. See below examples of these activities may relate to your therapeutic fields of study.
