## Lesley

"Lesley has been our safe guard over the past 5 Years" (parent)

Lesley was approved as an Extended families volunteer late 2012 and soon after was introduced to Kaiden (when he was 7 years old) and his family. Lesley and Kaiden catch up for a few hours every fortnight and do all sorts of fun things –rock climbing, mini golf, cycling, tennis, playing in the park and just hanging out. They've developed a great bond and both really look forward to spending time together.

#### Jane

Jane came to Extended Families in mid-2012. Since then she has been matched with Daniel and his family. She is very committed and reliable, visiting mostly on a weekly basis for over 5 years. Jane has developed a close relationship with the whole family. She spends time engaging in sensory experiences with Daniel, like playing with cushions and bubbles. In the warmer weather they spend lots of time out in the backyard and playing on the trampoline.

### Jill

Jill has been matched with Dhayaani since June 2012. Originally Jill's 15 year old grand-daughter was the one who had the idea about volunteering and we said she could join us, but that she needed to have an adult buddy volunteer with her in the role. Jill stepped in very willingly and although her grand-daughter is now an adult busy doing other things, Jill has continued to visit Dhayaani and her family regularly a couple of times a month and stayed an important part of the family's life.

### **David**

David has been involved in two families since coming on board as a volunteer in 2012. David first got involved with his current family 4 years ago and over this time has developed a supportive relationship with this family as a whole. David's spent time in the family home, and was also involved going out to celebrate family birthdays, attend school concerts and so on. David has often helped at various Family Day Events / Extendable Activities which has been appreciated.

Bel first meet her 'match' Olivia in September 2012, it was Bel's first volunteering role with Extended Families and she has remained a valued visitor to the family over these last 5 years.
